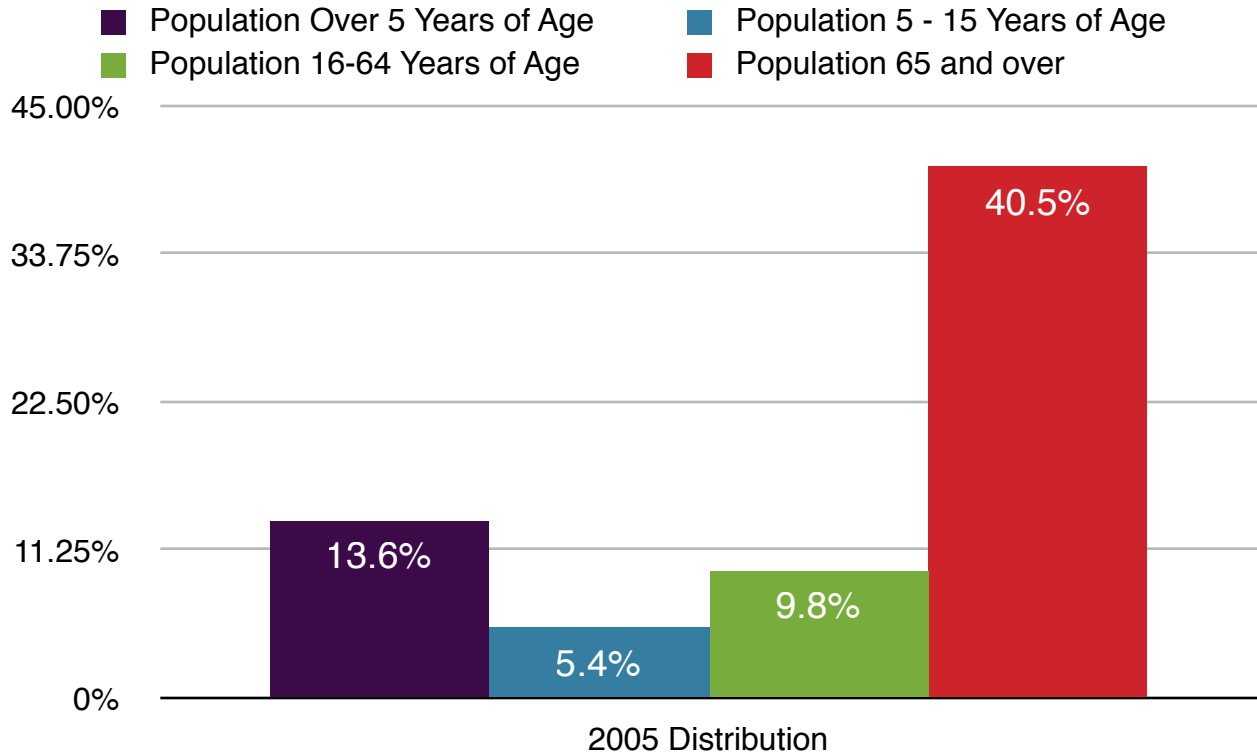

## Disability Status of Miami-Dade, % Reporting



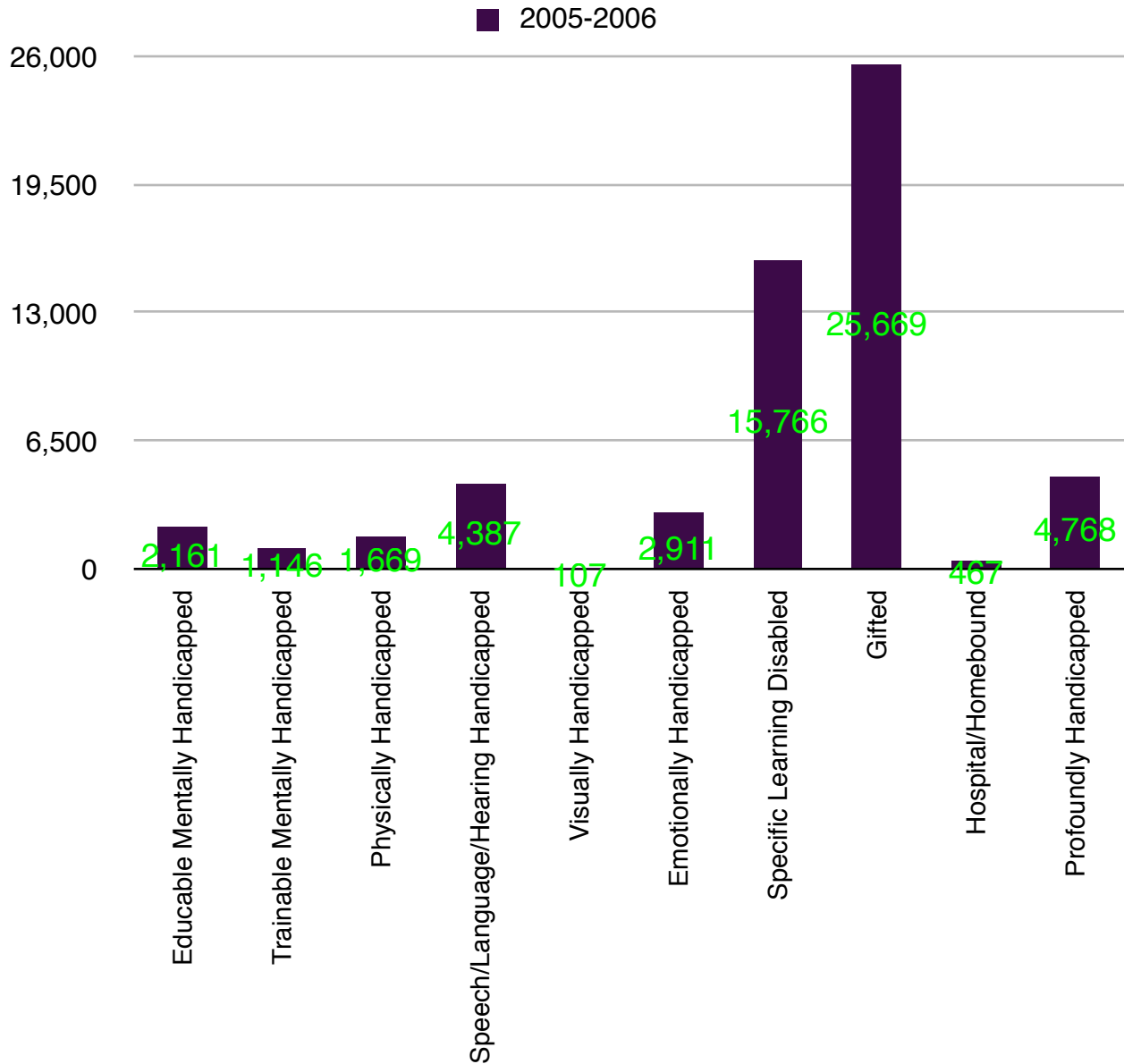
### What is this?

This is based on the U.S. Census's American Community Survey on the percent of Miami-Dade individuals who report a long-lasting sensory, physical, mental, or emotional condition. The condition can be an impediment to independent living.

### Why is this important & how are we doing?

With 12 % of the Miami-Dade population reporting a disability, and more than 1/3 of elders reporting a disability, Miami-Dade has a high percentage of disabled.

### What is this?

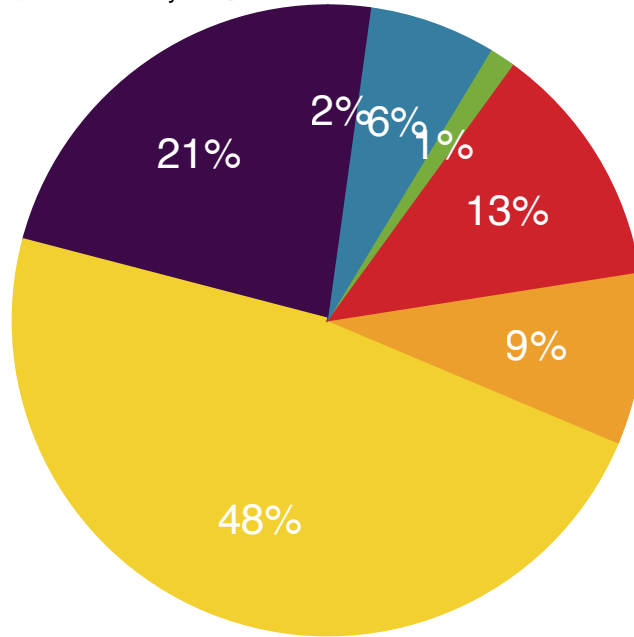
This is taken from the Miami-Dade County Public School's Office of Research Services "Statistical Highlights, 2005-2006".

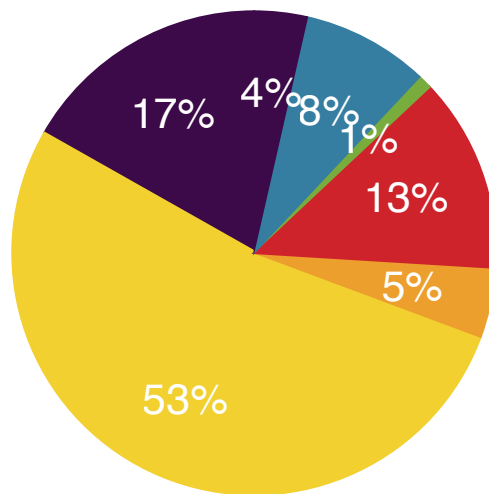


### What is this?
